We have heard Mr. S.N. Parashar, learned counsel appearing for the petitioners. We have also heard Mr. Gopal Jain, learned senior counsel appearing for respondent no.1 and Mr. Abhishek Kumar, learned counsel appearing for respondent no.6.

Since the quantum of compensation awarded by the High Court i.e. Rs.92,63,375/- plus accrued interest is a fair and reasonable compensation, we do not find any ground warranting interference

with the impugned order in exercise of our jurisdiction under Article 136 of the Constitution of India.

At this stage, Mr. Gopal Jain, learned senior counsel appearing for respondent no.1 has submitted that the Award amount plus accrued interest since has been disbursed to the claimants.

The special leave petition is accordingly dismissed.
