

HONOURABLE SRI JUSTICE B. VIJAYSEN REDDY

WRIT PETITION No.8794 OF 2022

ORDER:

This writ petition is filed to declare action of respondent No.4 - the Tahsildar, Damarcharla Mandal, Nalgonda District in not considering online application Nos.LM2200007794 and LM2200007800 of the petitioner and not issuing e-pattadar passbooks in respect of her lands admeasuring Acs.3-00 in Survey No.190, and admeasuring Ac.1-38 guntas in Survey No.135, total land admeasuring Acs.4-38 guntas, situated at Timmapuram Revenue Village Shivar of Damarcharla Mandal, Nalgonda District, as illegal, arbitrary and unconstitutional.

2. Heard Sri Rapolu Bhaskar, learned counsel for the petitioner, and learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue, and perused the material on record.

3. The case of the petitioner is that the subject lands were assigned to her by the Government of Andhra Pradesh in 1985 under the scheme of landless poor persons, mutated her name in all

the revenue records and issued pattadar passbooks and title deed through Passbook No.471489 - Khata No.289. The Government of Telangana initiated drive for issuing e-pattadar passbooks. The petitioner was issued 1-B Certificate. The petitioner submitted applications for e-pattadar passbooks in respect of the subject lands, but the same were not issued. Hence, the petitioner submitted applications through online application Nos.LM2200007794 and LM2200007800. However, no action is initiated by the respondents. Hence, this writ petition.

4. The learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue submits that directions may be issued to the respondents to act upon the online applications of the petitioner.

5. In view of the above, without entering into merits of the case, the writ petition is disposed of, at the stage of admission itself, directing respondent No.2 - the District Collector, Nalgonda, Nalgonda District, to forthwith act upon the online application Nos.LM2200007794 and LM2200007800 of the petitioner; respondent No.2 shall conduct enquiry by issuing notice to all

concerned / interested parties and pass orders, in accordance with law, within a period of eight (8) weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. No order as to costs.

As a sequel thereto, miscellaneous petitions, if any, pending in the writ petition stand closed.
